

ACCESSIBLE DESIGN GUIDELINES



Text

- Use mixed case (not all caps)
- Avoid long lines of text
- Add space between lines
- Use active tense (not past)
- Use at least 12-point for webpages
- Use at least 24-point for presentations & videos



Color

- User fewer than 7 colors
- Use consistent background colors
- Use consistent text colors
- On dark backgrounds, use light text
- On light backgrounds, use dark text
- Do not use red backgrounds








Icons &

Navigation Button

- Place icons in consistent locations
- Use common icons for navigation
- Provide instructions to help users
- Include options for users to go back
- Consider touch, mouse, and keyboard controls
- Use common words/icons for control (play, pause, home, etc.)



Hyperlinks

- Use underlined & colored text
- Hyperlink a few words rather than long URLs
- Use consistent coloring for hyperlinked text
- Provide text or directions for hyperlinked images/graphics
